But I can find someone who speaks Spanish. Can you call back at _____?: “Pero, puedo encontrar alguien que dice el español. Puedo regresar llamar en _____?”

Say: “Pear-O PuedO encontrar alguien kay dee-say el espanol. PuedA oo-stead la rey-ya-mada automatica en _____?”

Are you safe right now? ¿Usted es seguro ahora mismo?

Say: “oo-stead es seguro ahora meesmo?”

If you are not safe, please hang up and dial 911 to contact police: “Si usted no es seguro, por favor cuelgue y llame 911 para ponerse en contacto con la policía”

Say: “C oo-stead no es seguro por favor cuel-gay E yah-may nueve uno uno para poner-se contacto con la policia”

You are welcome to call back anytime: “Usted es bienvenidos a la rellamada automática cualquier tiempo”

Say: “oo-stead es beeyen-ven-E-dos a la rey-ya-mada automatic-ah cual-key-air tea-em-po”

One: Uno (oo-no)

Two: Dos (dose)

Mandatory Reporting Information

You are legally required to report when the individual is:

- »Currently under the age of 18
- »Currently age 60 or older and residing in a care facility
- »Currently age 65 or older
- »Has a disability as defined in Utah Code 62A-5-101
- »Actively suicidal
- »Reporting secondhand knowledge of abuse of any previously listed populations

Letting the client make an informed decision about disclosing identifying information

If you suspect the caller may fit one of the mandatory reporting populations – by his/her voice, something that has already been said, etc. – it is critical that you *quickly* make the caller aware of your obligation to report. An example that you could use with teenagers and adults might be:

“Before you go on, I want to let you know that I am obligated to report information I receive that involves a person under 18 (or over 65, etc...) who may be a victim of abuse if I have enough identifying information to do so.”

Then encourage the caller to go ahead with the call. Please remember it is critical to help the caller understand mandatory reporting so the victim will be in control of whether to disclose the information or not. Please remind the caller that obtaining identifying information is *not* the purpose of the call; the purpose is to provide support and to empower the victim.

When do we have enough information to make a report?

When it is *clear* that the victim fits one of the above categories and when you have identifying information such as first name and phone number (including from caller-ID), first name and school, or first name and address, etc.

Who should make the report?

- **Crisis line caller makes report when:** the immediate safety of the caller or victim is in question. See “Police Department” section to contact police, or if in doubt call the Salt Lake City Police Department dispatch at 799-3000.
- **RRC staff will make the report the next business day if the safety of the caller is not an immediate concern.** Volunteer shall inform the RRC staff of the call along with the necessary information.
- If the incident involves a child and the suspected perpetrator is a family member, RRC shall make the initial report to the Division of Children and Family Services (281-5151); otherwise the report shall be made to the local law enforcement agency.
- If the incident involves a person who resides in a residential care facility, a report shall be made to the local law enforcement agency and Adult Protective Services.
- If the victim is over 65 years of age or has a disability, a report will be made to appropriate law enforcement agency and Adult Protective Services.
- The RRC staff will document the date of report, name of the agency, the name of the person taking the report, and any case number assigned in the follow-up tab in the client database.
